



## WHY REWILD?

Rewilding offers hope for tackling the nature and climate emergencies – helping us transition to a nature-rich, low-carbon future while creating local benefits for people and the economy.


Britain's land and seas should be rich with life. Instead, we're one of the worst places for nature in the world. Over half our species are in decline and one in six are headed for extinction. Across the country, precious habitats are being damaged or polluted.

The effects of the climate and biodiversity crisis are being felt across Britain. Floods, droughts, wildfires and soil degradation are threatening our security and wellbeing. These are not separate issues; they're one interconnected problem affecting us all. The natural systems that can help us – healthy forests, peatlands, rivers, wetlands and seas – are broken.

We can't fix this with small tweaks. It needs radical change, and to achieve that businesses must play a central role.

Rewilding can help solve these big challenges. By urgently investing in and scaling up nature-based solutions, we can deliver lasting benefits for people and our environment. Rewilding is practical, proven and vital. Which is why it's supported by 83% of the British public.

Our 2030 ambition is to see a massive upscaling of rewilding, supporting a rich and diverse mosaic of habitats and species across 30% of Britain's land and seas.

Nurturing rewilding in practice, supporting a growing movement of rewilders to innovate and scale up their work as a powerful, collective force for change.

## THE IMPACT

Rewilding produces results – for nature, society and the economy.



#### **LAND RECOVERY**

By expanding and linking up native woodlands, peatlands, heaths, and grasslands, we can:

- Reverse biodiversity loss, giving nature space to recover
- Capture greenhouse gas emissions
- Improve our defences against flooding and wildfires
- Improve the quality of our air, water and soil



#### **MARINE RECOVERY**

By protecting and restoring underwater habitats and banning destructive practices like bottom trawling, we can:

- Store more carbon, helping fight climate change
- Rebuild marine biodiversity, bringing back lost species
- Strengthen coastlines against erosion, flooding, and rising seas



#### **RESILIENT ECONOMIES**

Rewilding creates jobs and protects livelihoods:

- Research found a 412% increase in jobs across 13 major rewilding projects
- Healthy habitats lower flood risk, purify water, and provide resources — cutting infrastructure costs and supporting resilient economies
- New green jobs and volunteering opportunities help businesses diversify
